

How long does it all take?

The exact length of time it takes to create your kitchen from the first step to the finishing touches will vary according to the furniture size and the worktop style you choose.

As an indication of what to expect, you should allow between a week and 10 days for the planning visit, and another week to allow us to complete the estimate. Once you've accepted your estimate, you'll be allocated a fitting date which is usually within six to 10 weeks. The fitting itself should require approximately five days, although the installer may have to complete the work in more than one visit.

What about payment?

Once you've accepted the estimate, you'll need to pay a non-refundable deposit of 20%. The balance, excluding 10% of installation costs, needs to be paid two weeks before your delivery date.
