


Lay out the parts on a soft level surface and compare to the part/fixings checklist on page 2. Do not discard any packaging until you are sure that you have all the parts.

Keep children clear during assembly as pack contains small parts which may present a choking hazard.








You will need:

1 x 6mm Allen Key (supplied)


Flat-headed screwdriver

Cot assembly - step 1



From the inside of the cot side (part B) attach one end (part A) using two 50mm bolts (fixing 1), taking care not to fully tighten the bolts at this stage.

Cot assembly - step 2




Tip the cot onto its side as shown and push four barrel nuts (fixing 3) into the holes in the base (part C) as shown above.

Make sure that the slots are visible and, if necessary, use a flat-headed screwdriver to ensure that the slots point towards the holes in the ends as shown. Select one of the 3 base heights and attach an end (part A) using four 65mm bolts (fixing 2). Do not fully tighten the bolts at this stage.


NOTE: The lowest base position is the safest and should be used as soon as your baby is old enough to sit up.

Cot assembly - step 3



Push four barrel nuts (fixing 3) into the remaining holes in the base (part C). Make sure that the slots are visible and, if necessary, use a flat-headed screwdriver to ensure that the slots point towards the holes in the ends as shown. Attach the second end (Part A) to the base using four 65mm bolts (Fixing 2) ensuring that they are placed in the correct pair of holes for the selected base height. Do not fully tighten the bolts at this stage. Fit two 50mm bolts (Fixing 1) through the holes in the side (Part B) to secure it to the end (Part A).

Cot assembly - step 4



Fit the second side (Part B) to the cot and secure using four 50mm bolts (Fixing 1). Taking care to push adjoining panels together, fully tighten all bolts. Your Cot is now ready for use.

Care and maintenance

Your furniture may be cleaned by wiping with a damp cloth and drying with a soft clean cloth.

Do not use abrasives, bleach, alcohol or ammonia-based household polishes.

Take care when handling or moving the furniture. Careless handling may cause damage.

Safety notes

Furniture can be dangerous if incorrectly installed. Assembly should be carried out by a competent person.

Keep children clear during assembly as pack contains small parts which may present a choking hazard.

Warning: Be aware of the risks of open fires and other such sources of strong heat, such as electric bar fires, gas fires, etc. in the near vicinity of the cot.

Warning: Do not use the cot if any part is broken, torn or missing and use only spare parts approved by the manufacturer.

Warning: Do not leave anything in the cot or place the cot close to another product, which could provide a foothold or present a danger of suffocation or strangulation, e.g. strings, blind/curtain cords, etc.

Warning: Do not use more than one mattress in the cot.

The lowest base position is the safest and should be used as soon as your baby is old enough to sit up.

The thickness of the mattress chosen must not reduce the internal depth (from the top of the mattress surface to the top of the side) to less than 500mm with the base in its lowest position or 200mm with the base in the highest position.

The mattress should be no more than 30mm shorter or narrower than the internal length or width of the cotbed. Suitable for use with a mattress of 1400mm in length, 700mm in width and a maximum thickness of 100mm.


All assembly fixings should always be tightened properly. Periodically check all fixings to ensure none have come loose, and that there is no risk of clothing or parts of the body becoming snagged or trapped.

To prevent falls, when the child is able to climb out of the cot, the cot should no longer be used for that child.

Do not allow your child to jump on the cotbed. This may result in damage to the furniture and/or injury to your child.

Toddler bed assembly

Separate the ends



To assemble as a toddler bed, begin by separating the lower panel and feet from the ends (part A). Insert eight barrel nuts (fixing 3) into the holes at each corner of the base (part C). If necessary, use a flat-headed screwdriver to ensure that the slots point towards the holes in the ends. Attach the ends (part A) using eight 65mm bolts (fixing 2). Taking care to push adjoining panels together, fully tighten all bolts.

Care and maintenance

Your furniture may be cleaned by wiping with a damp cloth and drying with a soft clean cloth.

Do not use abrasives, bleach, alcohol or ammonia-based household polishes.

Take care when handling or moving the furniture. Careless handling may cause damage.

Safety notes

For ages 18 months to 4 years.

Warning: Do not place this child's bed near heat sources, windows and other furniture.

Warning: Do not use this child's bed if any part is broken, torn or missing.

The mattress should be no more than 30mm shorter or narrower than the internal length or width of the bed. Suitable for use with a mattress of 1400mm in length, 700mm in width and a maximum thickness of 100mm.

Furniture can be dangerous if incorrectly installed. Assembly should be carried out by a competent person.

All assembly fixings should always be tightened properly. Periodically check all fixings to ensure none have come loose, and that there is no risk of clothing or parts of the body becoming snagged or trapped.

Do not allow your child to jump on the bed. This may result in damage to the furniture and/or injury to your child.

Children are likely to play, bounce, jump & climb on beds, therefore the child's bed should not be placed too close to other furniture or windows, blind cords, curtain pulls or other strings or cords. It should be placed either tight to any wall or have a gap of 300mm between the wall and the side of the bed.

The bed can be carefully dismantled for storage or transportation.

Keep children clear during assembly as pack contains small parts which may present a choking hazard.
